CALL FOR PAPERS

The International Institute for Justice and Development (IIJD), Inc. invites undergraduate students completing independent study or thesis work pertaining to the contemporary pursuit of justice and development in Africa to submit their work for inclusion in the inaugural publication of *The African Prospect*.

The IIJD is an international, non-partisan, independent consulting and educational nonprofit organization. It was founded in 2001 to promote the principles of democratic governance and the rule of law in developing African states through institutional reforms and capacity building. The IIJD considers the development of an independent judiciary and access to a free and fair justice system to be among the most important factors in advancing democracy, protecting human rights, and assuring sustainable development.

This issue of *The African Prospect* will feature a selection of the essays submitted to the International Conference on the State of Affairs in Africa (ICSAA) held in Boston, MA on October 26-28th 2006, and include the remarks by the President of Liberia, **Her Excellency Ellen Johnson-Sirleaf**. Additional notable authors include: **Dr. Alan W. White**, the Chief Investigator for the UN Special Court for Sierra Leone; **Dr. Muhammed Tawfiq Ladan**, the Presidential Commissioner of the Reform of Administration of Justice in Nigeria; **Dr. Eve Sandberg**, the President of Strategic Research Inc. and Associate Professor of Politics at Oberlin College; and **Francis M. Ssekandi**, a former Justice of Appeal for the Ugandan Supreme Court and presently a Lecturer in Law at Columbia University School of Law.

Submission Guidelines: Work contributed to *The African Prospect* does not need to be expressly written for the journal; in fact we prefer that students submit course work that they have already completed. Papers should be no more than 25 double spaced pages in 12 point Times New Roman font. All essays must be submitted via e-mail to theafricanprospect@iijd.org.
